A. FOUNDATIONAL HOPES:

1) I can hope in me:

2) I can hope in the Lord.

a) "But the eyes of the LORD are on those who fear him, on those whose hope is in his unfailing love, to deliver them from death... We wait in hope for the LORD..." Psalm 33:18-20

3) Resumé values vs. Eulogy values

 - a) "All who have this hope in Him (Christ) purify themselves just as He is pure."

 - a) "Let all that I am wait quietly before God, for my hope is in Him." Psalm 62:5

C. CHRISTIAN HOPE:

- 1) <u>Is the confident expectation that God is willing and able to fulfill the promises that He has made to you.</u>
 - a) "In His (God's) great mercy He has given us new birth into a <u>living hope</u> through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade kept in heaven for you." 1 Peter 1:3-4
 - b) "We have this hope as an anchor for the soul firm and secure." Hebrews 6:19
- 2) He is the Lord and He is our hope through every day our life, and he'll be with us through death. Death, itself, will not be the end of me. It will, in fact, be the beginning of real life forever with our Lord and Saviour. This is Christian hope this is the power of Christmas in us.
